Study this example situation:

Henry is very old. Nobody knows exactly how old he is, but: It is said that he is 108 years old.

He is said to be 108 years old.

Both these sentences mean: People say that he is 108 years old.



You can use these structures with a number of other verbs, especially: thought believed considered reported known expected alleged understood Compare the two structures:

- Cathy works very hard.
- The police are looking for a missing boy. It is believed that the boy is wearing a white sweater and blue jeans.
- The strike started three weeks ago. It is expected that it will end soon.
- A friend of mine has been arrested. It is alleged that he kicked a police
- Those two houses belong to the same family. It is said that there is a secret tunnel between them.

These structures are often used in news reports.

It is reported that two people were injured in the explosion.

- It is said that she works 16 hours a day. or She is said to work 16 hours a day.
 - or The boy is believed to be wearing a white sweater and blue jeans.
 - or The strike is expected to end soon.
 - or He is alleged to have kicked a police officer.
 - There is said to be a secret tunnel between them.
 - or Two people are reported to have been injured in the explosion.

(Be) supposed to

Sometimes it is supposed to ... = it is said to ...:

- Let's go and see that movie. It's supposed to be very good. (= it is said to be very good)
- Mark is supposed to have kicked a police officer. (= he is said to have kicked)

But sometimes supposed to has a different meaning. Something is supposed to happen = it is planned, arranged, or expected. Often this is different from what really happens:

- I'd better hurry. It's almost 8:00 and I'm supposed to meet Ann at 8:15. (= I have arranged to meet Ann; I said I would meet her)
- The train was supposed to arrive at 11:30, but it was an hour late. (= the train was expected to arrive at 11:30 according to the schedule)

You're not supposed to do something = it is not allowed or advisable for you to do it:

- You're not supposed to park your car here. (= You're not allowed to park here.)
- Mr. Bruno is much better after his operation, but he's still not supposed to do any heavy work. (= his doctors have advised him not to)
