#### erik's learning tip

How to "look up" phrasal verbs in a dictionary Phrasal verbs are special verbs made up of a short verb + a preposition. Here are some tips for searching for their meanings:

- 1. Search under the verb (for example, look).
- 2. Next, search within the 'look' entry. Phrasal verbs are normally at the end of the entry.
- 3. Some phrasal verbs have multiple meanings. Read the definitions and example sentences and search for the phrasal verb you are looking for.
