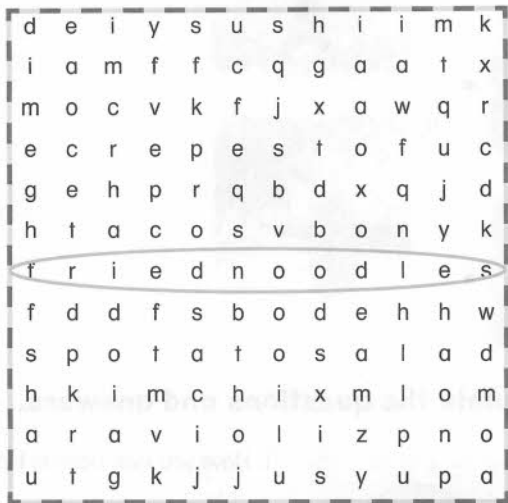

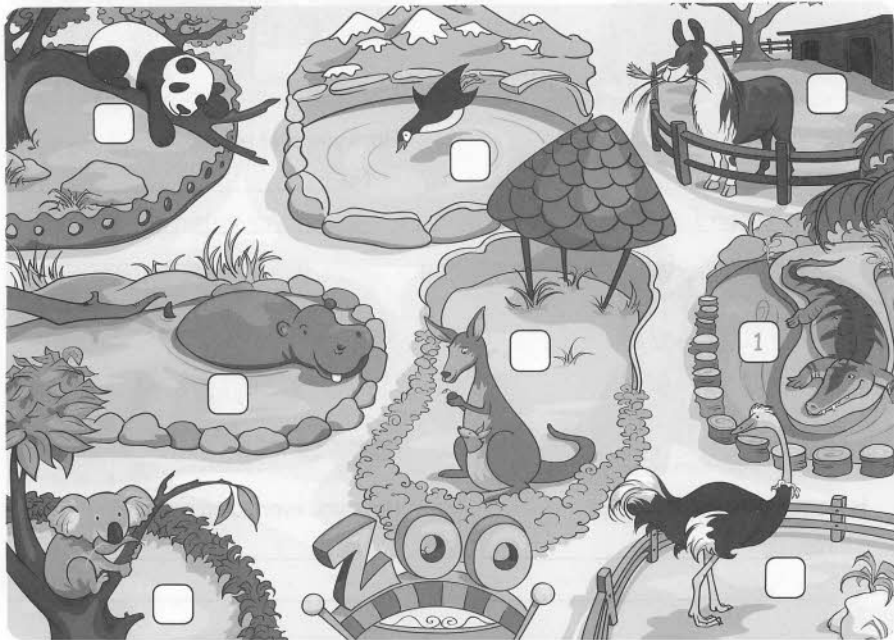

The Dream Catcher

You can make a dream catcher. Here is how to do it.



feathers



beads

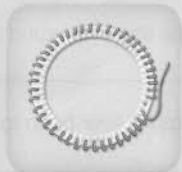


a paper plate



yarn

- Finally, tie feathers to the yarn.
- Now weave across the plate. A few pieces of yarn can hang down. Put beads on the yarn.
- Cut out the center of a paper plate. Around the plate, make holes about 1 cm apart.
- Hang your dream catcher on the wall.
- Put yarn into one hole. Then weave the yarn from hole to hole, up and over, around the plate.
- Sweet dreams!
