

Lesson 10 Use Linking Words

Sometimes, your description of an object can have two related parts. For example, Ava wrote the following sentences.

The statue is holding a torch.

The statue is holding a book.

The words **also**, **another**, **and**, **more**, and **but** are often used to link thoughts and ideas. Ava can combine the two sentences she wrote using linking words because they are both about what the statue is holding. Ava could join the ideas together to write the sentence below.

The statue is holding a torch and a book.

Circle the linking word in Ava's sentence.

Write another sentence to describe the statue. Use a linking word.
