
## **Chapter 4**

## Lesson I What Is an Opinion?

An **opinion** tells what you think about something. Your opinion can tell that you like or dislike something such as a book or movie. Your opinion can tell that you thought something was funny, silly, exciting, or scary. When you give an opinion, you should tell the reader why.
