(man) OK, you've convinced me. I'll be there.

(woman) So will I.

(woman) No way. You know how they're considering changing the schedule?

(man) They want to shorten it a little bit, don't they?

(woman) They want to shorten it a lot. They want to cut it in half.

(man) You mean, they want to reduce the final exam schedule from six days to three days?

(woman) That's right.

(man) But I have five final exams. If my five exams are spread out over six days, then I'll be OK, but if I have five exams in three days, I'm going to have a really hard time.

(woman) Me, too. I have five final exams, too.

(man) But why would anyone want to reduce the exam schedule from six to three days?
