





1. Pour a little chicken broth over the chops.




2. Chop the mushrooms, shallots, and cheese.

Each dish should include a food with the f or tf sound in it.


SPELLING

The sound t[is usually written with the letters ch or tch.


- ch cheap, chicken, cheese, children, teacher, which, much

- c cello, concerto









SPELLING

The sound d3 is usually written with the letters j or g.

- j job, just, joke, January, June, jail, injure, enjoy, subject
- g (before e, i, or y) general, dangerous, agency, suggest, passenger, engine, original, energy, biology, gym
- ge village, large, orange, age, average, college, language
- dge bridge, edge, judge, knowledge
- dj adjective, adjust

Other spellings:

d (before u or i) educate, graduate, gradual, individual, procedure, soldier
