Susan: Congratulations! We'll give you some spending money for your trip.

Ted: No need. The agent is footing the bill for everything.

And when we get there, he's going to wine and dine us.

Susan: He must think you're the cream of the crop.

Ted: He thinks we sound like the Goo Goo Dolls.

Nicole: Who are they?

Ted: You're really out of it. They're a popular rock band.

Nicole: Our family is certainly on a winning streak. I was elected president of the Spanish Club today.

Ted: The Spanish Club? Big deal!

Nicole: You don't get it, Ted. This is only the beginning. Today, president of the Spanish Club. Tomorrow, ambassador to Spain!

Ted: Well, Ambassador, you'll need to wrap up my chemistry homework before you leave for the Spanish Embassy.

Susan: A rock star and a diplomat I'm so proud of both of you!

Big deal! — So what? That doesn't really matter 大したことない、それっぽっちか

Example: You won five dollars in the lottery? Big deal!

メモ: "It's no big deal"という表現としても使われます。

Example: Don't worry about losing the book I lent you. It's no big deal.

(to) break into – to enter or be let into a profession その業界の道に入る(殴り込みをかける)

Example: If you want to **break into** journalism, it's a good idea to work on a college newspaper.

- ★ : "Break into"には他にもいくつかの意味があります。
- To interrupt. (邪魔をする) We weren't talking to you. Please don't try to break into our conversation.
- 2. To make a forcible entry into. (強制的に侵入する) Somebody broke into Jack's house and stole his DVD player.
- 3. Start something all of a sudden. (突然~し始める) After receiving the check from the National Cookie Company, Susan broke into song.

cream of the crop – the best of a group ある集団で最も出来の良い者

Example: In the world of women's tennis, the Williams sisters are the cream of the crop.

(to) foot the bill - to pay the bill

費用を持つ、勘定を支払う

EXAMPLE: You paid last time we went out for dinner. Let me foot the bill this time.

Synonym: to pick up the tab. Example: Do you mind picking up the tab this time? I paid last time.

(to) get it - レッスン21を見ましょう

(to be) out of it - not aware or knowledgeable about trends or modern habits

時代遅れの(トレンドや現代の習慣を知らない人)

EXAMPLE: Don't ask for Susan's advice on fashion. She's really out of it. She wears sneakers with everything.

SYNONYM: Out of touch

メモ: "Out of it"には、「うろたえている」、「ほーっとしている」や「(精神状態が)どうかしている」という意味もあります。

spending money - money for minor expenses

Example: Before Adam left for Europe, his parents gave him \$400 in spending money.

Synonym: pocket money

(to) wine and dine – to take someone out for an evening or an expensive meal

EXAMPLE: Donna wined and dined Bob and Susan and then presented them with a contract for the sale of Susan's Scrumptious Cookies.

(to be on a) winning streak — a series of wins 連勝

Example: The baseball team hasn't lost a game all season. They're on a winning streak!

(to) wrap up - to finish

Example: If you wrap up your homework by eight o'clock, we'll have time to catch a movie tonight.
