brown-noser [slang] - a person who's constantly trying to win favor with people above them, such as teachers or bosses ゴマすり

Example: Tiffany's co-workers think she's a brown-noser. She's always telling the boss how smart he is.

Example: Some people think Tom Hanks is by far the best actor in America today.

Synonyms: by a long shot; far and away; hands down

(to) count on (someone) – to depend or rely on someone ~に頼る、期待する

Example: My brother has a great sense of humor, so I can always **count on him** to cheer me up.

(to be) crazy about - レッスン5を見ましょう

full of oneself - to think too much of oneself

自分のことばかり考えている、うぬほれが強い

Example: After Angela appeared on the cover of Vogue magazine, she was really full of herself.

SYNONYM: to think oneself hot stuff. Example: Cara won the employeeof-the-month award, and now she thinks she's hot stuff.

(to) get down to business - to get serious about a task

EXAMPLE: The book club members spent the first two hours of their meeting eating and drinking before finally getting down to business.

Synonym: to get cracking

(to) get or to have under one's belt – to achieve or to have experience

Example 1: Tanya had three years of working for a large law firm under her belt before leaving to start her own firm.

Example 2: Ray needs to get an MBA under his belt to get a better job.

(to) give (someone) a run for one's money – to be strong competition

(人) にとって強力な競争相手

Example: We lost the soccer tournament, but we certainly gave the girls from Stamford High School a run for their money.

(to) give (someone) the cold shoulder – to be cold to someone on purpose; to snub someone

(人) に冷たくする、無視する

Example: When Lisa saw Amber at the mall, she didn't even stop to talk to her. She really gave her the cold shoulder.

Synonym: To blow someone off. Example: Amber can't understand why Lisa blew her off at the mall.

(to not) give (someone) the time of day — to ignore someone; to refuse to pay any attention to someone 冷たくあしらう

Example: Megan never gave me the time of day back in high school, but now she calls me all the time for advice.

goody-goody - self-righteously or annoyingly good

EXAMPLE: Melanie always sits in the front row and smiles at the teacher during class. What a goody-goody!

Synonym: teacher's pet. Example: Nicole always does her homework on time and offers to help her classmates. No wonder she's the teacher's pet!

it's a deal - I agree (to a proposal or offer)

Example: You'll make dinner every night for a month if I help you with your homework? Okay, it's a deal!

Synonym: you're on, Example: You'll give me a massage if I take out the garbage? You're on!

(to) kid around – to joke around; to tease からかう、ふざける

Example: Jeremy loves to **kid around**, so don't be offended by anything he says.

Synonym: to horse around, Example: While they were horsing around, Tammy accidentally poked Derek in the eye. He had to be rushed to the emergency room of the hospital.

(to) talk into - to persuade; to convince

Example: Chris didn't want to jump out of the plane, but Erin talked him into it.
