

TAIPEI, TAIWAN ¹Taipei 101, the world's highest building, opened in 2004 after six years of work. With 101 floors, it stands tall above the other buildings in Taipei—a half kilometer tall! ²"Tapei 101 reaches to the sky like a plant," says one of the architects*, C. P. Wang.

³Taipei 101 has eight sections**, a lucky number for the Chinese. ⁴It is also very strong. Taiwan often has earthquakes and strong winds, but they cannot damage it. ⁵The elevators are the fastest and most **modern** in the world. They travel at 60 kilometers per hour. You arrive on the 91st floor in 39 seconds, and from there you can look out over Taipei.

6By 2008, Seoul will have a taller building. But for now, Taipei 101 is Number One.

"Monstrous" Building Is Now World Famous


