KOREA ¹At 13, the Korean pop singer BoA made her first CD. It was **immediately** popular. In 2004, four years later, she won MTV's "Most **Influential** Asian Artist" award*.

²How did BoA **become** a **star** so fast? The people at a Korean recording studio** wanted a **future** girl star. They looked everywhere. When BoA's older brother went to the studio and sang for them, they asked, "Do you have a younger sister?"

³The answer to their question was BoA. She was only 11, but she sang and danced beautifully. The people at the studio were excited and quickly told

her **parents** about their **plan**. ⁴BoA's parents **were against** it. They wanted their daughter to study, not sing. But **at last** they agreed.

⁵The studio immediately gave BoA Japanese and English lessons. (An **international** star needs languages!) Later she got dance and music lessons.

⁶Now BoA performs for huge **crowds** in Asia and is ready to **conquer***** the world.

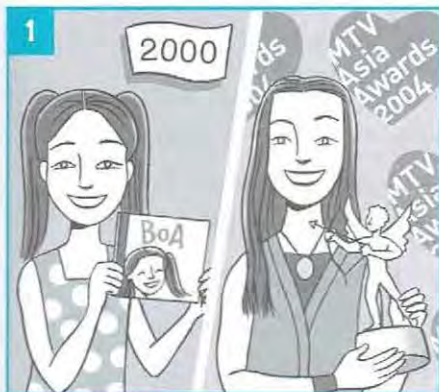
