Question 11 Test Flow:

Introduction:

- 1. In this question, you will be asked to state an opinion and give reasons for that opinion.
- 2. You will have 15 seconds to prepare and 60 seconds to give your opinion and support it with reasons and examples.
- 3. The focus of the question will vary, but it will always be an informal and familiar context.
- 4. Speak slowly and clearly, but say as much as you can in the time allowed.

Test Tips

- 1. Become familiar with common ways of stating your opinion.
- 2. Give a clear opinion.
- 3. Show what it is you are agreeing with, preferring or supporting.
- 4. Use sequence words to introduce and order your supporting reasons.
- 5. Focus clearly on the task.
- 6. Decide on your answer and plan your supporting points.
- 7. Choose an opinion and stay with it.
- 8. Think of reasons or examples for each supporting point.
- 9. Keep a steady pace and watch your timing.
- 10. Learn words and phrases to state and support an opinion.
- 11. Personalise your response.
- 12. Use phrases and hesitation devices to give you time to think.
- 13. Use language to show you have considered the other side of the argument, and to signal your transition back to your opinion.
- 14. Choose an answer you can say a lot about.

Test Technique

- 1. Choose the side you will defend.
- 2. Present your opinion (with a restatement of the question).
- 3. Introduce each supporting point and talk for around 15 seconds (adding reasons and examples) and remember to use hesitation devices to avoid long pauses.
- 4. If appropriate, add an opposing point before concluding with your opinion.
- 5. Be sure to include your reasons why this does not convince you to change your mind.
