- 1. Q: What is the main concern discussed in the dialogue?
 - **A:** The discussion focuses on whether to extend the project deadline to ensure quality deliverables.
- 2. **Q:** How does the Project Manager express the potential benefit of an extended deadline?

A: He uses a conditional sentence: "If we extend the deadline by a week, then we could ensure higher quality deliverables."

- 3. **Q:** Which modal verbs are present in the dialogue?
 - A: "Should" and "might" (e.g., "we should re-evaluate our milestones" and "we might compromise on quality").
- 4. **Q:** What is the proposed solution?

A: To add a one-week extension and adjust the project milestones accordingly.

Teacher's Lesson Points (Concise Version):

- Prep: Review dialogue; key terms (deadline, milestone, deliverable, extension).
- Intro (2–3 min): Discuss common challenges with deadlines.
