

#36.Daily Chat –電話の会話 Telephone

1. Let's Practice a Short Dialogue: Practice these conversations with your students.先生と一緒にこれらの会話を練習しましょう。

Conversation 1: Making a Phone Call – 電話をかけるとき

A: Hello, this is Kenji speaking.

A: もしもし、けんじです。

B: Hi, can I speak to Yumi?

B: こんにちは、ゆみちゃんはいいますか？

C: Hi Kenji, it is Maria here.

C: こんにちはけんじ君、マリアです。

Teacher Note: Practice basic phone greetings and introducing yourself.

先生用メモ: 電話のあいさつや自己紹介の表現を練習しましょう。

Conversation 2: Asking for Someone – 相手呼び出すとき

A: Hello, is Yumi there right now?

A: もしもし、今ゆみちゃんはいいますか？

B: Yes, just a moment, please.

B: はい、ちょっと待ってくださいね。

C: Sorry, she is not home now.

C: ごめんなさい、今いえにいません。

Teacher Note: Practice polite ways to ask for someone and how to respond.

先生用メモ: 相手呼び出す時の丁寧な聞き方と返答を練習しましょう。

Conversation 3: Asking Who is Calling – 誰からの電話か尋ねる

A: Can I ask who is calling?

A: どちらさまですか？

B: This is Kenji, Yumi's school friend.

B: ゆみちゃんの学校の友達、けんじです。

C: It's Maria from the dance class.

C: ダンス教室のマリアです。

Teacher Note: Learn how to politely ask and give your name on the phone.

先生用メモ: 電話で名前を尋ねたり名乗ったりする表現を学びましょう。

A: Can I please take a message?

A: 何か伝えておきましょうか？

B: Yes, please tell her I called.

B: はい、電話があったと伝えてください。

C: No thanks, I'll call again later.

C: いいえ大丈夫です、またかけます。

Teacher Note: Practice offering to take a message and polite refusals.

先生用メモ: 伝言を預かる表現や、断る時の丁寧な言い方を練習しましょう。

A: Okay, thanks for calling, bye.

A: わかった、電話ありがとう、またね。

B: Okay, have a great day now.

B: はーい、良い一日をね。

C: Bye for now, see you soon.

C: じゃあまたね、すぐに会おうね。

Teacher Note: Teach natural expressions to end a phone call.

2. Activity 1: Role Play Practice – ロールプレイ練習

Example Dialogue: Conversation 3

A: Can I ask who is calling?

B: This is Kenji, Yumi's school friend.

C: It's Maria from the dance class.

Teacher Note: Practice using gestures like pretending to hold a phone and speaking clearly.

先生用メモ: 電話を持つジェスチャーを交えて、ゆっくりはっきり話す練習をしましょう。

3. Activity 2: Create Your Own Dialogue – 会話を作ってみよう

Prompt: Create a short three-turn conversation about calling a friend's house and leaving a message.

プロンプト: 友達の家電話をして伝言を残すシーンで3ターンの会話を作ってみましょう。

Teacher Note: Encourage students to practice typical phone call phrases like "Is ____ there?", "Can I leave a message?" and closing greetings.

Conversation 1: Making a Phone Call

A: Hello, this is Kenji speaking.

C: Hi Kenji, it is Maria here.

Teacher Note: Practice basic greetings and self-introductions on the phone.

Conversation 2: Asking for Someone

A: Hello, is Yumi there right now?

B: Yes, just a moment, please.

C: Sorry, she is not home now.

Teacher Note: Practice polite ways to ask for someone and how to respond.

Conversation 3: Asking Who is Calling

A: Can I ask who is calling?

B: This is Kenji, Yumi's school friend.

C: It's Maria from the dance class.

Teacher Note: Practice asking and giving your name clearly on the phone.

Conversation 4: Taking a Message

A: Can I please take a message?

B: Yes, please tell her I called.

C: No thanks, I'll call again later.

Teacher Note: Teach how to offer to take a message and how to politely refuse.

Conversation 5: Ending the Call

A: Okay, thanks for calling, bye.

B: Okay, have a great day now.

C: Bye for now, see you soon.

Teacher Note: Practice natural expressions for ending a phone conversation.

2. Activity 1: Role Play Practice

Example Dialogue: Conversation 3s

A: Can I ask who is calling?

B: This is Kenji, Yumi's school friend.

C: It's Maria from the dance class.

Teacher Note: Encourage students to act out phone calls with gestures, like holding a pretend phone and speaking with clear tone.

3. Activity 2: Create Your Own Dialogue

Prompt: Create a short three-turn conversation about calling a friend's house and leaving a message.

Teacher Note: Have students practice common phone call phrases like "Is ____ there?", "Can I leave a message?", and polite closing lines.
